HUM 5GS: Modern Culture

Course Description

In HUM 5GS, we find ourselves part of a rapidly changing global society that originated in the cultural, intellectual, economic, scientific, and technological developments of what is known as the "Modern Era." Through lectures, readings, discussion, and writing assignments, students taking HUM 5 will explore the development of the Modern Era from the mid-nineteenth century up to the present. In particular, we will address the intellectual developments that fundamentally changed our understanding of the world around us as well as the larger questions of what it means to be human in the modern world.

We will use our time in the city of Santiago to explore the impact of modernization and industrialization on the development of Latin American culture as well as some of the ways that the civilizations and cultures of the Americas helped to shape the developments of the modern world. In doing so, HUM 5GS will also allow students to see both the development of Latin America and the broader Modern World in a different light.
