Scotland & England Under the Stuarts: Civil Wars and Revolution, 1603-1714

Course objectives: This five-week lecture-discussion course will examine the role of Scotland and England in the crisis of the seventeenth century. Students will master the general history of England and Scotland during the reign of the early Stuarts, from James I and Charles I to Charles II and James II with special attention to the role of religious conflict; the outbreak of military violence between Scotland and England in 1639-40; the constitutional struggle between Parliament and the Crown; the trial and execution of Charles I; the ascendancy of Oliver Cromwell and the military during the commonwealth era; the restoration of the monarchy in 1660, the Glorious Revolution that exiled James II in 1688 and established the English Bill of Rights, and Great Britain's rise to empire under William III and Queen Anne.

Assessment: i>clicker quizzes (20 points); an oral presentation (5 points); a one-hour mid-term (30% of final grade); a three-hour final exam (45% of the final grade). Both exams based on 100-point scale.
